## CHAPTER CLXIX.

*An ACT regulating the proceedings of county commissioners, and treasurers, in certain cases.*

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, if any county commissioner elected or appointed in pursuance of an act, passed the eleventh of April, one thousand seven hundred

dred and ninety-nine, entitled, "An act to raise and collect county rates and levies", or the treasurer of any county in this commonwealth, shall receive or hold any contract or shall be either directly or indirectly interested in the management or superintendance of any public work or improvement, by and under the authority of the board of commissioners of such county, the same shall be deemed a misdemeanor in office, and shall be punished in the manner prescribed in the twenty-third section of the said recited act for neglect of duty: *Provided always*, That the provisions of this act, shall not be so construed as to prevent the commissioners of any county, from receiving their lawful compensation when necessarily attending to the progress of any public work or improvement in their official capacity.
