CHAPTER CXCIX.

An ACT for the relief of Rudolph Spangler.

WHEREAS Simon Ford a servant of Rudolph Spangler, of York county, in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy-seven, enlisted in colonel Thomas Hartly's regiment, in the Pennsylvania line, and at the time
of

of his enlistment had one year and eleven months to serve, agreeably to the terms of his indenture, which his said master never received any satisfaction for, and as the services of the said Simon Ford were rendered to his country, during the late revolutionary struggle for its liberty and independence, it is but reasonable and just that the said Rudolph Spangler, should be indemnified for the same: Therefore,

Section. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the said Rudolph Spangler, be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of fifty three dollars and thirty-three cents, with interest from the first day of July, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-three, until the first day of August, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two on a warrant drawn by the Governor, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury of the commonwealth.
