CHAPTER XCVI.

An ACT granting a sum of money to the Trustees of the Union Academy of Doylestown, in the county of Bucks, for the use of said Academy.

SECTION I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of eight hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby granted to the trustees of the Union Academy of Doylestown, to assist and enable them to finish said academy, to be paid by a warrant to be drawn by the Governor on the State-treasurer, out of any unappropriated money in the state-treasury. A grant of \$800 to the Union Academy of Doylestown.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That there shall be admitted into said academy, any number of poor children who may at any time be offered, in order to be taught gratis: *Provided,* The number so admitted shall at no time exceed three, and that none of the said children shall continue to be taught gratis more than one year. Poor children may be taught gratis. Limitation of the number to be admitted at one time, &c. of the period for tuition.
