

## CHAPTER LXXXVIII.

*A SUPPLEMENT to the act entitled an act to provide for the erection of a house for the employment and support of the poor in the county of Cumberland.*

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the legislature that the time fixed by law for the citizens to be elected for to receive proposals for the sale of lands whereon to erect a house for the employment and support of poor in the county of Cumberland, has been too limited for them to perform that service: Therefore,

**SECT. I.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the time specified by law for the five citizens to purchase a site and piece of ground, whereon to erect a house for the employment and support of the poor in the county of Cumberland, be extended to the first day of December next.

## CHAPTER LXXXIX.

*An ACT granting an annuity to Robert Varnor.*

**W**HEREAS it has satisfactorily been made appear that Robert Varnor, of Mifflin county; did, in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, enlist as a soldier, and that at the battle of Monmouth, he was wounded in the right arm, by reason whereof and old age, he is now unable to acquire a livelihood by labour: Therefore,

**SECTION I.** *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the state-treasurer in favour of John Stewart, of Fermanaugh township, Mifflin county, or his lawful attorney, for forty dollars, to be paid out of any unappropriated monies in the treasury, to be applied to the use of Robert Varnor, and that an annuity of forty dollars be granted to the said Robert Varnor, to be paid half yearly, to the said John Stewart, his executor or executors, administrator or administrators, his or their lawful attorney, to commence from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and nine, by the state-trea-

sure; which annuity shall be expended by the said John Stewart, his executor or executors, administrator or administrators, his or their lawful attorney, in providing clothing, lodging and diet for the said Robert Varnor; and it shall, and it hereby is made the duty of the said John Stewart, his executor or executors, administrator or administrators, his or their lawful attorney, to make an annual return to the orphans' court of Mifflin county, on oath or affirmation, how and in what manner he or they have executed the trust in him or them confided by this act.

Said Stewart to be accountable to the orphan's court for the execution of the trust.

CHAPTER XC.

*An ACT for the relief of James Seals and Samuel Israel.*

SECTION I. *BE* it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum of forty dollars be paid unto James Seals and Samuel Israel, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury of the commonwealth, in full for the repair of public arms, in the county of Greene.

CHAPTER XCI.

*An ACT to repeal so much of an act passed April fourth, one thousand eight hundred and seven, as directs the township assessors, to select and return jurors, and also allowing peremptory challenges in certain cases.*
