CHAPTER XCVIII.

An ACT to authorize Samuel Ray, junior, to crect a toll bridge over French Greek, opposite Buck-street, in the town of Franklin.

SECTION I. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the

authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for Samuel Ray, junior, his heirs and assigns, to erect, build, maintain and support a good and substantial bridge over and across French creek, opposite Buck-street, in the town of Franklin, in Venango county; and the property of said bridge, when built, shall be and the same is hereby vested in the said Samuel Ray, his heirs and assigns for ever; and the said Samuel Ray, his heirs and assigns may demand and receive toll from travelthereof vest- lers and others, not exceeding the following rates, viz. For Ray and his every coach, landau, chariot, phæton, or other pleasure carriheirs.
