

CHAPTER CVI.

An ACT to continue in force an act entitled “ An act to provide for the payment of certain balances of purchase money yet due, and remaining charged on lands which have been patented on warrants which have been obtained since surveys were originally made, in pursuance of old proprietary warrants and locations, and for other purposes,” and an act, entitled “ An act regulating and continuing the distribution of donation land.”

SECT. I. *BE* it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the act, entitled “ An act to provide for the payment of certain balances of purchase money yet due and remaining charged on lands which have been patented on warrants which have been obtained since surveys were originally made, in pursuance of old proprietary warrants and locations, and for other purposes; and all matters and things therein contained be, and the same is hereby continued in force until the first day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twelve, (the limitation clause only excepted.)”

Parts of a certain act of assembly extended.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the first section of the act, entitled “ An act regulating and continuing the distribution of donation lands, passed March twenty-fifth, one thousand eight hundred and five, and all matters and things therein contained be, and the same is hereby continued in force until the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ten.”

And also the first section of the act for regulating the distribution of donation lands.

 CHAPTER CVII.

An ACT granting an annuity to Hugh Quay.

WHEREAS it hath been represented to the Legislature, that Hugh Quay, early in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, enlisted as a sergeant in the Chester county flying camp; that on the sixteenth day of November, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, he was taken prisoner by the British at Fort Washington; and in the inclement winter of that year, he was confined in Bridewell prison, in the city of New-York, destitute of every comfort of life, that he was ultimately restored to his country, his wife and five
