

CHAPTER V.

RESOLVED by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, That the secretary of the commonwealth be, and he is hereby directed to procure thirty-nine copies of the minutes of the convention, including the minutes of the committee of the whole, that framed the present constitution, provided the same can be procured at a price not exceeding three dollars per copy; and that the said secretary first having caused them to be bound and lettered, shall distribute them in the following manner, to wit: Two copies for the table of the House of Representatives, one copy for the table of the Senate and the residue to be by him transmitted, one copy to each county organized, and shall be sent forward with the laws and journals of the present session, and deposited in the commissioners' office of each county, to be open to the inspection of the citizens. And that the expense incurred in consequence thereof, be paid out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

Secretary to procure 39 copies of the minutes of the convention, &c. Price not to exceed 3 dollars per copy. How to be distributed.

CHAPTER VI.

Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

RESOLVED by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That our senators in Congress be instructed and our representatives requested; and they are hereby so instructed and requested to use their influence to procure the passing a law establishing weights and measures. Resolved, That the Governor be and he is hereby requested to transmit a copy of this resolution to the executive of the United States, in order that it may be presented to Congress at their next session.

CHAPTER VII.

RESOLVED by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That it shall be the duty of the secretary of the commonwealth, to forward to the prothonotaries of the several counties, a copy of the laws passed during the present session of the legislature, and likewise a copy of the laws passed at the second session of the tenth Congress of the United States, as soon as they are printed and he shall receive them, to each of the members representing such counties in the legislature (the clerks and assistant clerk of each house respectively) with the name of such member or clerk written on the title page. And it shall be the duty of the prothonotaries, after receiving said copies, to deliver them to such members and clerks when applied for. Provided, That a member or clerk re-
