

CHAPTER XXXIX.

An ACT for the relief of certain county treasurers.

SECTION I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

That the auditor-general be, and he is hereby authorized and required to enter a credit on his books in favour of any county treasurer for such sum or sums of money as shall appear to him to have been paid to the commissioned and staff-officers for training in the spring of one thousand eight hundred and eight, and cannot be recovered, but it shall be the duty of the treasurer in order to entitle him to such credit to furnish the auditor-general, with a certificate on oath or affirmation of himself, or of the commanding officer of the regiment, which oath or affirmation shall state the sum or sums so paid, and to whom they were paid, and the reasons why they cannot be recovered, and if those reasons appear satisfactory to the auditor general, the treasurer shall be allowed the amount so certified in settling his accounts with the auditor-general.

Monies paid to militia officers for certain services to be allowed to the county treasurers. Duty of the treasurer.

CHAPTER XL.

A further SUPPLEMENT to an Act, entitled "An act regulati the fisheries in the river Conestogoe, in the county of Lancaster."

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

That from and after the passing of this act, the sluices and plat-forms specified in the act to which this is a supplement, shall be kept open for and during the months of April, May and June, in every year.

Certain sluices, &c. to be kept open.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the act to which this is a supplement, as is hereby altered or supplied, is hereby repealed.
