CHAPTER LI.

An ACT to authorize the continuance of the courts of quarter sessions of the peace, for the counties of Lancaster and Dauphin, beyond the time to which they are now restricted.

SECTION I. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, the judges of Courts of the court of quarter sessions of the peace, for the counties of quarter ses Lancaster and Dauphin, shall be, and they are hereby autho-caster and rized and empowered to continue the sessions of the said court Dauphin during the whole of the first week of each and every term or so to continue many days as they shall deem necessary to finish the business for one week thereof, any law to the contrary notwithstanding

if necessary.
