CHAPTER LVII.

An ACT for the relief of Patrick M'Gee.

WHEREAS it appears that Patrick M'Gee enlisted in captain Huston's company, col. Frederick Watt's regiment of the flying camp, and that he was taken prisoner at Fort Washington; and after some time was liberated on parole, in a state of indisposition, and continued indisposed near a year; and that he never received any compensation for the time he was held in confinement, nor while he lay sick in consequence thereof:

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That immediately after the passing of this act the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Patrick M'Gee, or his lawful attorney, the sum of one hundred dollars, out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, in full for his services as aforesaid. § 109 granted to Patrick M'Gee.

CHAPTER LVIII.

An ACT taxing certain offices.

SECTION I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the prothonotaries or clerks of the supreme courts, of Prothonotaries clerks
