## CHAPTER LIX.

An ACY concerning Foreign Insurance Companies.

SECT. I. BE it exacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That no body politic or corporate, of any foreign state, kingdom No person or or country, no company or co-partnership of foreigners, by them-persons, &c. selves, or any agent or agents of such company or co-partnership, not citizens and no person or persons who is or are not a citizen or citizens of the U. S. of the United States, shall be insurers in any case within this state, against loss at sea, against loss by fire, upon any property within the same, upon the inland transportation of any goods, wares or merchandize, in or out of this state, or upon the life or lives of any person or persons residing within the same, and all contracts and policies entered into by any such person or persons, company, co-partnership, or body politic or corporate, as insurers, shall be null and void.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if any person or persons shall make or renew any contract Any person or policy of insurance as assurers, on account, or in behalf of, or agent for as agent or agents for any body politic or corporate of any foreign such foreign state, kingdom, or country, any company or co-partnership of insurers foreigners, or any person or persons who is or are not a citizen liable to a or citizens of the United States, within this state, every such \$5,5000. person or persons so offending, shall, on conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction, forfeit and pay the sum of five thousand dollars for every such offence, one half to the use of the commonwealth, and the other to the use of the informer, who shall sue for the same.

SECT. III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if any citizen or citizens of this commonwealth, shall make Penalty on or renew any contract or policy of insurance, as a party insured making or with any foreign company or corporation, any agent or agents policy with for any such company or corporation, or with any person or such foreign persons who is or are not citizens of the United States, every insurer. person so offending, shall, on conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction, forfeit and pay the sum of five hundred dollars, to the uses aforesaid, and in all and either case or cases, the policy or policies shall be deemed and received as conclusive evidence of such contract or insurance: Provided nevertheless, That the penalty herein mentioned shall not be constru-Policies to be ed to extend to any case of marine insurance made in any foreign the contract. country by any agent or agents for any American merchant or mer- Proviso exchants, so as to secure the vessel or cargo belonging to any Ameri- cepting macan merchant or merchants, nor to prevent any foreigner or for-rine insuraneigners from having his, her or their property insured within this state, excepting only an alien enemy.

An ACT to annul the marriage of David Carmack and Mary Carmack.

[ ] HEREAS it satisfactorily appears to the legislature, that Mary Carmack, late Mary Schneider, was lawfully joined in marriage on the twenty-seventh day of December, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred, to David Carmack, and that the said David Carmack was at a court of general quarter sessions, of the peace, held at Philadelphia, in and for the county of Philadelphia, of March sessions, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eight, convicted of forgery on two several bills of indictment, as appears by the record thereof, for which crime he was sentenced to an imprisonment at hard labour for the term of two years on each bill, in the jail of Philadelphia county, where he now remains: And whereas it appears proper for the legislature to grant the said Mary a divorce: Therefore,

SECTION I. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennyslvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the marriage contract entered into by the said David Carmack and Mary his wife, late Mary Schneider, be, and the same is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties respectively set free and discharged from the marriage contract, and from all mack annul- duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully, effectually and absolutely, as if they had never been joined in marriage, but nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect or render not to be af illegitimate, any child or children born of the body of the said
