## CHAPTER LXXIII.

An ACT to prevent devises and legacies from lapsing in certain cases.

Sect. I. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representaral Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority o we same, No devise or That from and after the passing of this act, no devise or legacy in favour of a child or other lineal descendant of any testator, favour of ali-shall be deemed or held to lapse or become void by reason of the neal descen decease of such devisee or legatee, in the life-time of the testator, if such devisee or legatee shall leave issue, surviving the testator, but such devise or legacy shall be good and available in favour of such surviving issue, with like effect, as if such devisee or legatee had survived the testator: Provided always, That Proviso excepting cer. nothing herein contained shall be construed to effect any devise tain devises, or legacy contained in the last will of any testator who shall have deceased before the passing of this act: And provided also, Proviso as to That nothing herein contained shall be construed to defeat the of the testa- intention of any testator, to exclude such surviving issue, or any of them,

## CHAPTER LXXIV.

An ACT enlarging and altering the charter of the rector, church wardens and vestrymen of the United Episcopal churches of Christ church and St. Peter's church, in the city of Philadelphia, in the province of Pennsylvania, and for other purposes therein mentioned.
