

ing, be again examined by the aforesaid inspector, and if found sound and merchantable, agreeably to the intent and meaning of this act, they shall or may be exported or transported as aforesaid; but if unsound, they shall be subject to the same regulations as stated in the second section of this act, and the aforesaid inspector shall have and receive from the person or persons selling the aforesaid barrels or half barrels of shad or herring, for his expense and trouble for opening, examining and heading each and every barrel as aforesaid, the sum of three cents.

And similar proceedings had as before mentioned.

Compensation of the inspector.

SECT. VI. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all and singular the forfeitures and penalties in and by this act (or the act to which this is a supplement) imposed, shall be collected by the inspector of salted provisions for the time being; one half thereof to be paid over by him to the guardians of the poor, in and for the city and county of Philadelphia, for the use and benefit of the poor of the said city, and districts thereto annexed; and the other half thereof to be retained by the said inspector; and if the said forfeitures and penalties be under the sum of one hundred dollars, the same shall and may be sued for and recovered in like manner as debts under one hundred dollars may be sued for and recovered within this commonwealth; or if the said forfeitures and penalties be above the sum of one hundred dollars, the same shall and may be sued for and recovered by bill, plaint or information, in any court of record within this commonwealth.

Penalties to be collected by the inspector for the time being. How appropriated.

SECT. VII. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much and no more of the act to prevent frauds in the packing and preserving of shad and herring for exportation, as is hereby altered and supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER XCV.

An ACT to afford immediate relief to Philip Jones, and granting him an annuity.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the legislature, that Philip Jones enlisted in the service of his country early in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, and faithfully served therein for the space of four years and eight months; that whilst in service he had his feet severely frozen, and one of his eyes so much injured by a stroke

on the night of the attack on the Block house; that he hath since lost the sight thereof; and that he is now far advanced in life, and from this circumstance and the causes aforesaid is incompetent to support himself by manual labour: Therefore,

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer shall, and he is hereby directed to pay Philip Jones, or his lawful attorney, the sum of forty dollars out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, and an annuity of forty dollars for the use of Philip Jones, to be paid half-yearly to Michael M'Clees, of Willistown township, Chester county, his executor or executors, administrator or administrators, or his or their lawful attorney, to commence from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ten, which annuity shall be expended by the said Michael M'Clees, his executor or executors, administrator, administrators, or his or their lawful attorney, in providing clothing, lodging and diet for the said Philip Jones, and it shall be, and it is hereby made the duty of the said Michael M'Clees, his executor or executors, administrator or administrators, or his or their lawful attorney, to make an annual return to the orphans' court of Chester county, on oath or affirmation, how and in what manner he or they have executed the trust in him or them confided by this act.

CHAPTER XCVI.

An ACT to enable the Governor to incorporate a Company for making an artificial road from Anderson's ferry on the Susquebanna, to intersect the turnpike road from the borough of Lancaster to Columbia, at or near the Five mile stone.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Henry Share, Henry Cassell, John Miller, John Hautz, John Coble, George Snyder, Casper Snyder, and Andrew Gerber, of the county of Lancaster, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several duties herein after mentioned: *That is to say,*

§40 to be paid to Philip Jones. And an annuity of like amount to Michael M'Clees, for his use.
