An ACT establishing an academy in the borough of Gettysburgh, in the county of Adams, and granting a sum of money thereto.

Sect. I. B^E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the sume, An academy That there shall be, and hereby is established in the borough of established Gettysburgh, in the county of Adams, an academy, or publick school for the education of youth, in the English and other languages, in the useful arts, sciences and literature, by the name, style, and title of "Gettysburgh Academy," under the care, di-Style and tirection and government of eight trustees, to wit: Reverend Wil-Trustees na- liam Paxton, William Gilliland, Alexander Russel, James Dobbin, Doctor William Crawford, William Maxwell, William Miller, and Robert Milheny; which said trustees and their successors to be elected as is hereinafter mentioned, shall be, and hereby are declared to be one body politic and corporate, in deed and their success in law, by the name, style and title of "The trustees of Getty burgh Academy:" and by the same name, shall have perpetubody corpoal succession, and shall be able to sue, and be sued, plead, and be impleaded in all courts of record and elsewhere, and shall be competent and capable in law and equity, to take and to hold to them and their successors, for the use of said academy, lands, tenements, hereditaments, goods, and chattels, of whatsoever kind.
