CHAPTER CVII.

An ACT granting a sum of money for the purpose of building a Bridge over Shenango, and opening a Road in the County of Mercer.

SECTION I. > SECT. III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That the said contractors shall, as soon as they have commenced the work agreeably to their respective contracts, be entitled to receive one-half of the sums contracted for, and the remaining half shall be deposited in the treasury of said county, to be paid on orders of the commissioners as soon as the contracts shall have been complied with, and the accounts settled, and for receiving and paying said money, the said treasurer shall receive of the same, two dollars and no more.

SECT. IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That the commissioners of said county shall, when the contracts respectively are finished, lay the accounts with the of the work, contract or a copy thereof before the auditors chosen or ap pointed, and who will next meet to settle the accounts of the commissioners and treasurer of said county, whose duty it shall be to proceed immediately to view said work, and shall settle and adjust the accounts thereof at the time of auditing the accounts for which they were appointed; and the said sation to be commissioners and auditors shall receive the same amount of pay, and in the same manner as they are entitled to for performing the other duties of their office.

CHAPTER CVIII.

An Act to extend the Act entitled, " An Act concerning Strays." SECT. I.
