And further, that the said society may purchase, take, receive and enjoy any lands, tenements, rents, annuities, rights or privileges, or any goods, chattels, or other effects of what kind or nature soever, which shall or may hereafter be given, granted, sold, bepowered to queathed or devised unto them, by any person or persons, bodies politic or corporate, capable of making such gift, grant, sale or bequest; and the said property, real or personal, to rent, sell, convey and confirm, or otherwise dispose of, as fully and effectually as any person or persons, bodies politic or corpo-Provided the rate may or can do: Provided, That the clear annual income proceeds of, of all such property shall not exceed the sum of five thousand dollars: And provided also, That the funds of said corporation shall not be employed for any other purpose than the dissemination of the knowledge of the English language, the mechanical arts, or agriculture, and the knowledge of the Christian religion among the Indian tribes.
