## · CHAPTER'CXXXVI.

An ACT authorizing the judges of the supreme court to establish return days.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the judges of the supreme court be, and The judges they are hereby authorized to appoint special return days in preme court the courts, in bank, in each and every district of the supreme to appoint court, at fixed periods, in term time, or in vacation, as by them special reshall be deemed expedient for the convenience of suitors and turn days: the furtherance of justice, and the days and times so appointed, as return days shall be entered of record, by the Prothonota ries of the said courts respectively, and shall thereafter be deemed legal return days in the said courts respectively.

## CHAPTER CXXXVII.

An ACT confirming the titles of James Hickman, John King, and others, to certain lands, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

SECT. I. PE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the deeds of conveyance made and executed to James The deeds of Hickman and John King, respectively, by Joseph Moore and conveyance Lucy, his wife, being both dated the first day of March, one executed to thousand eight hundred and seven, and recorded in the office man and for recording of deeds in Delaware county, in book 2, page John King, 760, and 762, be, and the same are hereby declared to be as by Joseph valid in law, to all intents and purposes, as if the said Joseph Moore and Moore had been a citizen of the United States, at the time of red to be vahis purchasing the said land, and of executing the deeds of lid. conveyance aforesaid: Provided always, That nothing herein Proviso. sontained shall be construed to bar or defeat the right or title, interest, claim or demand of any person or persons, bodies politic, or corporate, which they or any of them may have in, or to the said messuage and tracts, or parcels of land, or any part thereof.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Joseph Miles, one of the administrators of James

SECT. III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, The title of That the title of George Chandlee to a certain tract of land in Aston township, bounded by Chester creek, by land of Abra-Chandlee to ham Coppock, Samuel Vernon, and by the road leading to tract of land Duttor's mill, containing one hundred and forty-four acres, declared val-more or less, be, and the same is hereby declared to be as valid in law to all intents and purposes, as if William Lancaster had been a citizen of the United States, at the time he purchased the same: Provided, That nothing herein contained shall be construed to bar or defeat any person or persons, bodies politic or corporate, of any right, title, interest, claim or demand, which they may have in or to the said tract of land, or any part or parcel thereof.

## CHAPTER CXXXVIII.

An ACT to authorize the governor to appoint commissioners for the purpose of laying out a road from the town of Washington to the state line, in a direction toward Wheeling in the state of Virginia, at or near William Slator's, where the present road crosses the same.
