

cash or on credit, the plantation aforesaid, and that all contracts and agreements, deeds and conveyances, of or concerning the same to be made by the said Seneca Lukens, shall be as good and effectual in law to all intents and purposes, as if the same were to be made by the said minors after they severally attain the age of twenty-one years, and the proceeds of such sales shall by the said Seneca Lukens, (with the approbation of the orphans' court of Bucks county,) be made safe on good real security, for the benefit of the said minors respectively, in such proportions or shares as is directed by the last will and testament of the said Isaiah Quinby.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be the duty of the said Seneca Lukens before he shall proceed to sell the said plantation or tract of land, to enter into recognizance with sufficient security before the orphans' court of the county of Bucks, for the faithful execution of the duties and powers hereby granted; *Provided,* That the legal rights of all other persons shall remain as fully and effectually as if this act had never been passed.

## CHAPTER XXXVII.

*A SUPPLEMENT to an act entitled, "An act authorizing the governor to contract with John Bioren for printing a certain number of copies of the laws of this commonwealth."*

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met,* and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay, immediately after the passing of this act to John Bioren, four thousand five hundred dollars in advance on his contract for printing the laws in four volumes.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That upon delivery by the said John Bioren of the whole number of copies by him to be furnished on or before the last day of August next, if the judges of the supreme court shall approve thereof, and if the secretary of the commonwealth, state treasurer and auditor-general, or any two of them whose duty it shall be to examine the work shall likewise approve thereof, the auditor-general shall thereupon draw his warrant on the state trea-

surer in favour of the said John Bioren for the remainder of the money due to him for the work aforesaid, to be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Governor to contract with John Bioren for an additional volume of the laws.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in order to continue a publication of the laws correspondent with and in continuation of the said edition, the governor be and he is hereby authorized and required to receive the proposals and contract with the said John Bioren, he giving security for performance on his part, for one thousand three hundred and fifty copies of an edition, to include in one volume the acts of the present session and the three succeeding sessions of the legislature, to be printed in the same manner with the volumes provided for in the act to which this is a supplement, with a complete index and proper notes and references, to be delivered in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth, at the price of two dollars and fifty cents per copy, payable on approbation of the work by the legislature. *Provided,* that said Bioren waves his contract already existing for printing in a volume form the laws from the session eighteen hundred ten-eleven to the session eighteen hundred thirteen-fourteen, inclusive.

Two dollars fifty cents per copy to be allowed, Bioren to waive a former contract.

2,000 dollars to be paid to Charles Smith,

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby required to pay immediately after the passing of this act, the sum of two thousand dollars to Charles Smith, and moreover on the completion of the above mentioned work, and it having been approved as required by the second section of this act, then it shall be the duty of the state treasurer to pay to said Charles Smith, as a compensation in full, the further sum of two thousand dollars out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.
