

surer in favour of the said John Bioren for the remainder of the money due to him for the work aforesaid, to be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Governor to contract with John Bioren for an additional volume of the laws.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in order to continue a publication of the laws correspondent with and in continuation of the said edition, the governor be and he is hereby authorized and required to receive the proposals and contract with the said John Bioren, he giving security for performance on his part, for one thousand three hundred and fifty copies of an edition, to include in one volume the acts of the present session and the three succeeding sessions of the legislature, to be printed in the same manner with the volumes provided for in the act to which this is a supplement, with a complete index and proper notes and references, to be delivered in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth, at the price of two dollars and fifty cents per copy, payable on approbation of the work by the legislature. *Provided,* that said Bioren waves his contract already existing for printing in a volume form the laws from the session eighteen hundred ten-eleven to the session eighteen hundred thirteen-fourteen, inclusive.

Two dollars fifty cents per copy to be allowed, Bioren to waive a former contract.

2,000 dollars to be paid to Charles Smith,

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby required to pay immediately after the passing of this act, the sum of two thousand dollars to Charles Smith, and moreover on the completion of the above mentioned work, and it having been approved as required by the second section of this act, then it shall be the duty of the state treasurer to pay to said Charles Smith, as a compensation in full, the further sum of two thousand dollars out of any unappropriated money in the treasury.

CHAPTER XXXVIII.

An ACT vesting the title of a certain piece of land in Washington township in the county of York in certain trustees and their successors for the use of a school.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the officers of the land-office are hereby authorized and required to issue a warrant and complete a title clear of purchase money and

Land officers to issue a warrant for a piece of land in York

office fees for a piece of land containing fourteen acres, be the same more or less, situate in Washington township, York county, adjoining lands of Amos Hussey, Jacob McMillan, Amos Griffith, Joseph McMillan, and William Bennet, unto John Cleaver, John Smith, and Elisha Cook, of York county, and their successors to be appointed as herein after directed, in trust and for the sole use and benefit of such school or schools as may from time to time be erected thereon; *Provided always*, That the right or title of any person or persons to said land which may have accrued prior to the passing of this act, shall not be prejudiced or affected thereby.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That in case of the death, resignation or removal of all or either of the said trustees or their successors, out of the neighbourhood of said school, it shall be lawful for a majority of the subscribers to said school as often as occasion may require, to choose other trustees to supply such vacancy.

How vacancies in the board of trustees are to be supplied.

CHAPTER XXXIX.

A SUPPLEMENT to the act entitled “An act to alter the time of holding certain courts of Quarter Sessions and Common Pleas, in the county of Delaware.”

SECT. I *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That from and after the passing of this act, the courts of quarter sessions and common pleas in the counties of Chester, Montgomery and Bucks, shall commence and be holden at the same time they would have been holden had the act, to which this is a supplement, not been passed. *Provided always*, That no proceedings heretofore had in the said courts, shall be held to be void in consequence of any supposed misconstruction of the said act as to the time of holding the several terms, but the same shall be
