An ACT to enable the Governor to incorporate a Company for making an artificial road from the Court House in the borough of York, to end at or near Wolf's tavern in a direction towards Gettysburg.

SECT. 1. end at or near Wolf's tavern, in a direction towards Gettysburg," and shall thereupon give notice in three of the public newspapers, one in the town of Hanover, one in York, and one in Gettysburg, for one calendar month at least, of the times and places when and where the said books shall be kept open to receive subscriptions for the stock of the said company, at which respective times and places some two of the said commissioners shall attend and permit and suffer all persons of lawful age who shall offer to subscribe in the said books, in their own name or the names of any other persons who shall duly authorize the same, for any number of shares Time of keeping in the said stock, and the said books shall be kept open resopen the books. pectively for the purpose aforesaid, at least six hours in every juridical day, for the space of six days, or until the said books shall have two hundred shares therein subscribed, and if at the expiration of the said six days, the books aforesaid shall not have the number of shares aforesaid therein subscribed, the said commissioners may adjourn from time to time and transfer the May adjourn and said books from the town of York elsewhere, until the whole number of shares shall be subscribed, of which adjournments and transfer, the commissioners aforesaid shall give such public notice as the occasion may require, and when the whole number of shares subscribed in all the said books, shall amount to two hundred, the same shall be closed: Provided always, That every person offering to subscribe in the said books in his own or any other name, shall previously pay to the attending commissioners, the sum of five dollars for every share to be subscribed, out of which shall be defrayed the expenses attending the taking such subscriptions, and other incidental charges, and the remainder shall be paid over to the treasurer of the corporation as soon as the same shall be organized, and the officers chosen as hereafter mentioned.

> SEGT. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That when twenty persons or more shall have subscribed one hundred shares of the said stock, the commissioners shall certify under their hands and seals, the names of the subscribers and the number of shares subscribed by each, to the governor, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for him, by letters patent under his hand and the seal of the state, to create and erect the subscribers, and if the said subscription be not full at the time, then also those who shall afterwards subscribe to the number aforesaid, into one body politic and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of, "The President, Managers and Company of the York Western Turnpike Road," and by the said name the subscribers shall have perpetual succession, and all the privileges and franchises incident to a corporation, and shall be capable of taking and holding their said capital stock and the increase and profits thereof, and of en

larging the same from time to time by new subscriptions in such manner and form as they shall think proper if such enlargement shall be found necessary to fulfil the intent of this act, and of purchasing, taking and holding to them and their successors and assigns, and of selling, transferring and conveying in fee simple, or for any less estate, all such lands, tenements, hereditaments and estates, real and personal, as shall be necessary to them in the prosecution of their works, and of suing and being sued, capable of suing and being sued, and being sued. and of doing all and every matter and thing which a corporation or body politic may lawfully do.
