by oath or affirmation, to the judges of the court of quarter sessions of the said county, it shall be the duty of the said judges to appoint three commissioners to view the said dam and compare it with the limitations and provisions herein set forth and enacted, and report to them at their next sessions in the said county the state thereof, whereupon if it shall appear thereby that any offence has been committed against this act, it shall be the duty of the court to direct a bill of indictment to be sent to the grand jury, and upon prosecution to conviction, the said Ichabod Buck and William Buck, their heirs or assigns, shall be liable to pay a fine not exceeding two hundred dollars at the discretion of the court; which fine shall be paid to the supervisors of the highways of the township of Willingborough, for the repair of the roads in said township; and the said court shall order so much of the said dam to be abated, at the proper cost and charge of the person or persons erecting the same, as shall bring the same within the limitations and provisions of this act.

CHAPTER LXXXI.

An ACT confirming the title of Christopher Faatz, Jacob Heintz, Christian Heintz, Christopher Heintz, Adam Greiner and Nicholas Griener, aliens, to certain lands therein mentioned, and to enable them to hold other lands.

WHEREAS it appears to the legislature that Christopher Faatz, Jacob Heintz, Christopher Heintz, Christian Heintz, Adam Greiner and Nicholas Greiner, natives of Saxony in Germany, emigrated to the state of Pennsylvania several years ago, and have severally declared their intentions of becoming citizens of the United States; that about three years ago they erected a glass manufactory in the township of Upper Smithfield, in the county of Wayne; and that they acquired the equitable title and received four several deeds of conveyance in fee-simple, for several tracts of land: *And whereas*, it has been farther stated, that if the title of the aforesaid tracts of land are perfected, and they allowed to purchase a reasonable quantity of other lands for the erection of another glass manufactory thereon, and for fuel for the same, that they are desirous and intend so to do, for the manufacturing of window and other glass; Therefore,

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Christopher Faatz, Jacob Heintz, Christian Heintz, Christopher Heintz, Adam Greiner and Nicholas Greiner, aliens, natives of Saxony in Germany, shall have and hold to themselves, their heirs and assigns, four several tracts, pieces and parcels of land, situate in the township of Upper Smithfield in the county of Wayne, which they obtained by purchase by four several deeds of conveyance, made to them by Caleb Hill and Rebecca his wife, Tilton Hill, Levi Vanauken and Jonathan Jones, Elias Mushback and John Mushback, in the same manner and for the same estate they would have been entitled to therein had they been citizens of this commonwealth, or of the United States at the time of their purchase.

Christopher Faatz and others authorized to hold certain lands in Wayne county.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said Christopher Faatz, Jacob Heintz, Christian Heintz, Christopher Heintz, Adam Greiner and Nicholas Greiner, or either of them, are hereby authorized to acquire by purchase, any quantity of land not exceeding one thousand acres each, in addition to the quantity mentioned, and have, hold and enjoy the same, to themselves, or either of them, their or either of their heirs and assigns, in as full a manner as they or any of them could do were they citizens of this commonwealth, or of the United States.

Also authorized to purchase and hold other lands to a certain amount.

CHAPTER LXXXII.

An ACT imposing certain duties upon the commissioners and treasurer of Luzerne county, and empowering county commissioners to administer oaths or affirmations.

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be the duty of the commissioners and treasurer of Luzerne county to keep a separate and distinct account of the monies raised and collected from the county district of Susquehanna, and shall therefrom pay and discharge all and singular the costs and expenses of levying, assessing and collecting, the same costs and prosecution chargeable to the
