CHAPTER LXXXVIII.

An ACT to enable the governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the Portage branch of the Allegheny river at Smethport, by the way of Instanter and Rich Valley to the Portage branch of the river Sinnemahoning, in the county of M'Kean.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That

Commissioners nominated to open books of subscription.

Charles W. Hare, Benjamin B. Cooper, John Keating, James Allen, Thomas M'Clintock, William Vicry, John Hays and William Wilson, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several things herein after men-

tioned, that is to say, they shall on or before the first day of January next procure two books and in each of them enter as follows, "We whose names are hereunto subscribed do promise to pay to the president, managers and company of the Allegheny

aforesaid therein subscribed, the said commissioner or commis-Power to adjourn sioners may adjourn from time to time and transfer the said books elsewhere until the whole number of shares shall be subscribed, of which adjournments and transfer the commissioners aforesaid shall give such public notice as the occasion may re-

quire, and when the whole number of shares subscribed in all the said books shall amount to four hundred, the same shall be closed; Provided always, That every person offering to sub-Proviso. scribe in the said books in his own or any other name shall previously pay to the attending commissioner or commissioners. the sum of five dollars for every share to be subscribed, out of which shall be defrayed the expenses attending the taking such subscriptions and other incidental charges, and the remainder shall be paid over to the treasurer of the corporation as soon as the same shall be organized and the officers chosen as herein after mentioned.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, Twenty persons That when twenty persons or more shall have subscribed one subscribed 100 hundred shares of the stock, the commissioners shall certify pany to be incorporated by the stock of the stock. under their hands and seals, the names of the subscribers and porated. the number of shares subscribed by each, to the governor of this commonwealth, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the governor by letters patent under his hand and the seal of the state, to create and erect the subscribers, and if the said subscription be not full at the time, then also those who shall afterwards subscribe to the number aforesaid, into one body politic and corporate in deed, and in law, by the name, style style of the and title of, "The president, managers and company of the Al-copposition, their powers and legheny and Susquehanna turnpike road," and by the said name privileges. the subscribers shall have perpetual succession, and all the privileges and franchises incident to a corporation, and shall be capable of taking and holding their said capital stock and the increase and profits thereof and of enlarging the same from time to time by new subscriptions in such manner and form as they shall think proper, if such enlargement shall be found necessary to fulfil the intent of this act, and of purchasing, taking and holding to them and their successors and assigns, and of selling, transferring and conveying in fee simple, or for any less estate, all such lands, tenements, hereditaments and estates, real and personal as shall be necessary to them in the prosecution of their works, and of suing and being sued, and of doing all and every matter and thing which a corporation or body politic may lawfully do.

SECT. III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, Notice to be given That the commissioners aforesaid or a majority of them, as soon and place for as conveniently may be after the said letters patent shall be organizing the company. sealed and obtained, shall give notice in two of the public newspapers, one in the town of Northumberland, and one in the city of Philadelphia, of a time and place by them to be appointed, not less than twenty days from the publication of the first notice, at which time and place the said subscribers shall proceed to organize the said corporation, and shall choose by a majority of votes of the said subscribers by ballot, to be delivered in per-

in what manner, gers, one treasurer, and such other officers as they shall think necessary to conduct the business of the said company for one year, and until such other officers shall be chosen, and shall and may make such by-laws, rules, orders and regulations, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of the United States, or of this commonwealth, as shall be necessary for the well ordering the affairs of the said company, and generally have like powers, authorities and privileges necessary for carrying on and completing the said turnpike road, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications, restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures, By what rule the and be entitled to like tolls and profits in proportion to the distance as are given and granted to, "The president, managers and company of the Susquehanna and Lehigh turnpike road," passed the nineteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and four; Provided, That if the company shall not proceed to carry on the said work in three years after the passing of this act, or shall not within ten years afterwards complete the said road according to the true intent and meaning of this act, then in either of these cases, all and singular the rights, liberties and franchises hereby granted to the said company shall revert to this commonwealth.

CHAPTER LXXXIX.

A SUPPLEMENT to an act entitled, "An act to authorize the governor to appoint commissioners for the purpose of laying out a road, beginning at or near Kelso's ferry in Cumberland county, through York and Adams counties, to the Maryland line, in a direction to the city of Washington."

SECT. 1. P.E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized to appoint three commissioners to review and lay out a road, beginning at the state road leading from Harrisburgh to Carlisle at or near Kelso's ferry in Cumberland county, by the nearest and best route to or near Eichelberger's tavern, in York county, through Gettysburgh in Adams county, to the Maryland line in a direction to the city of Washington; and the commissioners
