CHAPTER CIV.

An ACT establishing an academy in the town of Mercer, in Mercer county, and to grant a sum of money thereto.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Penusylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That there shall be and hereby is established in the town of Mercer, in Mercer county, an academy or public school for the education of youth in the English and other languages, in the useful arts and sciences, and literature, by the name, style and title of the "Mercer academy," under the care, direction and government, of eight trustees; viz. the reverend John Walker, the reverend Samuel Tate, Hugh Bigham, Joseph Smith, James Braden, Samuel B. Forster, Ebenezer Maguffen, and Nathan Patterson, which said trustees and their successors, to be elected as herein mentioned, shall be, and hereby are declared to be one body politic and corporate in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of, Style of the cor. "The trustees of the Mercer academy;" and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in all courts of record and else-

where, and shall be competent and capable in law and in equity to take and to hold to them and their successors, for the use of said academy, lands, tenements, hereditaments, goods and chattels of whatever kind, nature or quality, real, personal or mixed, by gift, grant, bargain, sale, conveyance, assurance, will, devise, or bequest, from any person or persons whatever capable of making the same, and from time to time to grant, bargain, sell, demise, alien or dispose of the same for the use of said academy; and to erect such buildings as may be necessary, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which shall be lawful for them to do for the well being of the said academy and the due management and ordering the affairs thereof; Provided always, That the yearly income of the estates or notto exceed money shall not exceed four thousand dollars.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, No trustee to be That the number of trustees shall be eight as aforesaid, and than four years, they shall be so changed as that none of them shall continue in &c. office more than four years at any one time without being re-elected by the people of said county, and for that purpose it shall be the duty of the said trustees at their first meeting, when not less than five of them shall be present, which number shall be a quorum to do business, and they are hereby authorized and required to cast lots for ascertaining the members to be changed each year until the whole number shall be changed; and in orare to be

That the sum of two thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby granted by the state for the use of said academy, to be paid to the treasurer of said institution by the commissioners of Mercer county, out of a loan of money granted to them from the state for the use of the county by an act of the general assembly, passed the tenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ten, on the orders of the aforesaid trustees, or any five of them, and the receipt of the said trustees shall be received by the state treasurer in part payment of said loan, at any time after the passing of this act, and the money so appropriated shall under the direction of the trustees herein before mentioned, be applied one half thereof in the erection of a building or buildings suitable for the accommodation of the institution, and the purchasing of books, mathematical instruments, and the necessary philosophical apparatus, and the remaining half shall be placed in some productive fund or funds, and the income thereof shall be forever applied in aid of other revenues to compensate a teacher or teachers in said academy; and there shall be admitted into said academy, in consequence of the aforesaid appropriation, any number of poor children that may at any time be offered in order to be taught gratis; Provided, That the number so admitted and taught shall at no time be greater than five, and that none of the said children so admitted shall continue in said academy to be taught gratis, should others apply, longer than two years.
