CHAPTER CXLVIII.

An ACT to encourage the constructing of certain great and leading roads, within this commonwealth, and the erection of bridges over the Susquehanna, at Harrisburg, Northumberland, Columbia and McCall's ferry.

SECT. I. BE it enucted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum of eight hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars, be, and the same hereby is appropriated for the purposes, and to be applied as hereinafter directed.
