CHAPTER XIV.

An ACT supplementary to an act, entitled "An act establishing an academy in the town of Meadville, in Crawford county, and granting a sum of money thereto."

Property formerly vested in the trustees of Meadville academy, to be transferred.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That all the lands, tenements, rights, debts, dues, and property of every kind and description whatsoever, vested in the trustees for a public seminary of learning in the town of Meadville, in Crawford county, by virtue of an act, entitled "An act to empower the trustees of Crawford county to erect a suitable building for a seminary of learning in the town of Meadville; and of the acts supplementary thereto; and of an act, entitled "An act granting a sum of money to the Meadville seminary, in the county of Crawford," be and they are hereby transferred to, and vested in the trustees and their successors, constituted by virtue of the act to which this is a supplement, for the purposes and uses contained in said act; and that the power, office, and authority of all former trustees prior to the passing of the act to which this is a supplement, be and they are hereby revoked and determined.

And vested in the trustees and their successors, constituted by the act to which this is a supplement. Power of former trustees revoked.

Auditors of Crawford county to settle the accounts of the trustees whose office is determined.

Suits brought by former trustees not to abate. Present trustees to demand and receive from former ones, all money due from them to

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the auditors of the public accounts of the county of Crawford, be and they are hereby empowered and enjoined to settle and adjust the accounts of the trustees, whose office is hereby determined, in the manner directed, and under the penalties prescribed by the sixth section of the act to which this is a supplement.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That no suit, brought by the trustees whose office is hereby abolished, for any money due to a seminary of learning in the town of Meadville, shall abate, or be discontinued, but the same shall continue and be prosecuted to judgment and recovery, for the use of the academy established by the act to which this act is a supplement; and it shall be the duty of the treasurer of the said academy, for the time being, to demand and receive of the said trustees, whose office is abolished, all monies recovered by

them, or that may be recovered by them in that capacity; and in the institution for its use. case of default made, it shall be the duty of the trustees established by the act to which this act is a supplement, to sue for and recover the same for the use of the said academy.

CHAPTER XV.

An ACT to authorize the administrators of James Wheeler to convey a certain tract or parcel of land to the purchaser.

WHEREAS it appears that James Wheeler, late of the county of Luzerne, deceased, was seized in his lifetime as of an estate in fee simple, of a certain tract or parcel of land, situate in the township of Braintrim and county of Luzerne, which he in his lifetime did sell, and engage to convey to Daniel Sterling, of said county, for the consideration of six hundred and fifty dollars; part of which, to wit, five hundred and twenty-four dollars, was paid to the said deceased in his lifetime, but as there is no written evidence of the said sale, to enable the administrators of the said deceased, to make and execute a deed to the said purchaser, consistent with the laws of this commonwealth: Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* David B. Wheeler and Zebulon Butler, administrators of James Wheeler, deceased, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered, upon receipt of the residue of purchase money due, to make and execute to the said Daniel Sterling, a deed of conveyance for all the right, title, estate and interest that the said James Wheeler had in his lifetime, to a certain tract or parcel of land, containing ninety-two acres and sixty-four perches, with allowance, &c. situate in the township of Braintrim and county of Luzerne, and known and distinguished by being part of lot number eleven in said township, adjoining lands of Daniel Lum, and now in the possession of the said Daniel Sterling, which deed shall vest the title in the said Daniel Sterling, as fully as if the said James
