CHAPTER XVI.

An ACT to enable George Gantz, Henry Kunkle, and others elders, church wardens, and trustees of religious societies, called the Lutheran congregations in the townships of Codorus, Shrewsbury, and Hopewell, in the county of York, to sell and convey certain lands.

WHEREAS it hath been represented to the legislature, that George Gantz and Henry Kunkle, elders, trustees and church-wardens of Jerusalem's church; Jacob Erhart and Michael Ness, elders, trustees and church-wardens of Zion's church; and Francis Hartman and Martin Kurtz, elders, trustees and church-wardens of Saddler's church, in the townships of Codorus, Shrewsbury and Hopewell, in the county of York, purchased on the seventeenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and four, three several pieces or parcels of land, for the use, convenience and accommodation of the said congregation, as church land, otherwise called glebe land, and the said three pieces or parcels of land, not answering the purposes for which they were bought, the elders trustees and church wardens aforesaid, believing themselves not vested with power to sell and convey the same, legally discharged of the trusts and uses appurtenant thereto, have prayed for power to do the same: Therefore, for remedy thereof,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That George Gantz, Henry Kunkle, Jacob Erhart, Michael Ness, Francis Hartman, and Martin Kurtz, elders, church-wardens and trustees of the respective religious societies called the Lutheran congregations, in the townships of Codorus, Shrewsbury and Hopewell, in the county of York, or a majority of them be, and they are hereby empowered and authorized to sell and convey by good and sufficient deed, three several pieces of land, which the said elders church-wardens, and trustees purchased in trust, on the seventeenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and four, as glebe land, for the use of the aforesaid religious societies, called*

the Lutheran congregations; the first piece or parcel of the said three tracts or parcels of land, being situate in the township of Shrewsbury aforesaid, and containing eighty-six acres, with allowance of six per centum for roads, &c. purchased of John Bailey and Margaret his wife; the second piece or parcel of said land, being situate in the townships of Shrewsbury and Codorus aforesaid, containing three acres and thirty perches, neat measure, purchased of John Boyer, and Mary his wife; and the third piece or parcel of said land being situate in the townships of Shrewsbury and Codorus aforesaid, containing three acres and one hundred and thirty-nine perches, neat measure, purchased of Andrew Schneider and Anna Maria his wife; free, clear and discharged of the trusts and uses aforesaid, in as full and as ample a manner as if the same three parcels of land were the private property of the said elders, church wardens and trustees.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be the duty of the elders, church wardens, and trustees aforesaid, having first sold the whole or any part of the said three parcels of land, to apply the money arising from the sale thereof, to the payment of any arrears of purchase money that now are, or then may be due on the same; and the balance, if any remain of said money to hold subject to the order, and disposal of the said congregations.

CHAPTER XVII.

An ACT for the relief of Miles Crowley, an old soldier of the revolutionary war.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state-treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Miles Crowley or order, the sum of forty dollars, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.
