

CHAPTER LXVIII.

An ACT for the relief of Richard Harding.

\$144 41 to be paid to R. Harding.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the treasurer of this commonwealth shall, immediately after the passing of this act, pay to Richard Harding, or his lawful attorney, out of any money in the treasury, the sum of one hundred and forty-four dollars and forty-one cents, with interest thereon since January fourteenth, one thousand seven hundred and ninety four, being the amount due to the said Richard Harding, for his depreciation pay, and which had escheated to this commonwealth.

CHAPTER LXIX.

An ACT granting an annuity to Joseph Johnson, for life, and also granting to him a tract of donation land.

40 dollars to be paid to James Scott. And an annuity of like amount to J. Johnson, in trust, &c.

How to be expended.

Statement to be made to the orphans' court.

Tract of donation land

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state-treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized to pay to James Scott, of Butler county, or order, the sum of forty dollars, for the use of Joseph Johnson of Butler county; and that an annuity of forty dollars be granted to said Joseph Johnson, to be paid half yearly during his life, to James Scott, of Butler county, aforesaid, his executors, or administrators, his or their lawful attorney, by the state-treasurer; to commence the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twelve; which annuity shall be expended by the said James Scott, his executors or administrators, his or their lawful attorney, in providing clothing and diet for the said Joseph Johnson; and it shall be and hereby is made the duty of the said James Scott, his executors or administrators, his or their lawful attorney, to make an annual statement to the orphans' court of the county of Butler, aforesaid, on oath or affirmation, shewing the manner in which he or they have executed the trust reposed in him or them by this act; and it shall be the duty of the clerk of said court, to file said account without fee or reward.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the officers of the land office are hereby authorized and di-

rected, on the application of the said Joseph Johnson, or his lawful attorney, to them for that purpose made, to issue a patent to him for a donation tract of land of two hundred acres unalienable during his life. granted to J. Johnson.

CHAPTER LXX.

A further SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled "An act establishing the seat of government of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, at Harrisburgh, in the county of Dauphin."

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of thirteen thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated, to complete the fire-proof offices at Harrisburgh, the building of which was authorized by the sixth section of the act to which this is a supplement. \$ 13,000 appropriated.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the money hereby appropriated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be paid by the treasurer of the commonwealth, on the order signed by any two of the commissioners appointed under the act aforesaid, who are hereby enjoined and required to keep regular and true accounts of all the monies they may expend in completing the offices aforesaid, and to transmit said accounts with necessary vouchers to the auditor-general, agreeably to the act aforesaid and the supplements thereto. SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the secretary of the commonwealth, secretary of the land-office, surveyor-general, state treasurer, and auditor-general, be and they are hereby authorized, and it is made their duty to employ and contract with one or more carpenters, to make suitable counters, shelves, and other necessary furniture, in all the departments of the offices of government in said buildings, for the reception and safe-keeping the books and documents belonging to their respective offices, and transmit the accounts to the auditor-general, who shall draw his warrant on the treasurer of Shelves, counters, &c. to be erected.
