CHAPTER LXX.

A further SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled " An act establisbing the seat of government of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, at Harrisburgh, in the county of Dauphin."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and bouse of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That \$ 13,000 apthe sum of thirteen thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby propriated. appropriated, to complete the fire-proof offices at Harrisburgh, the building of which was authorized by the sixth section of the act to which this is a supplement.
