company are hereby authorized to commence, and progress turning the said road at any other point they may think proper, exceeding the distance of fifty miles from the said borough of Harrisburgh, and on commencing at such point, and the distance of five miles having been completed and approved of, the governor is hereby required to draw his warrant on the treasury, in favour of the said company, for a proportional part of the said subscription for the said section, and also for a proportional part of the said subscription for ten miles in advance, progressing from the said second point and so on in advance on the completion of the said section, and of every subsequent section of ten miles.

Governor to draw his warrant, &c.

Seven commissioners may act. Company to be organized at Bedford.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in all cases, any seven of the commissioners named in the act to which this is a supplement, shall be competent to act, and the place at which the subscribers shall proceed to organize the corporation, and elect their officers under the provisions of the third section of said act, shall be the town of Bedford.

Repealing section.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of any act or acts as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER LXXVIII.

An ACT to authorize the administratrix of John Fitz Randolph, late of the county of Wayne, deceased, to convey two certain lots of ground to the purchaser thereof.

Caty Randolph authorized to convey certain lots, &c.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Caty Randolph, administratrix of the estate of John Fitz Randolph, deceased, be, and she is hereby authorized and empowered, by a sufficient deed in law, to convey and assure to Mathew Ridgway, his heirs and assigns, all the right, title, interest, property, and estate whatsoever, in law or equity, which the said John Fitz Randolph, in his lifetime had, of, in, and to two certain lots of ground, with a house thereon erected, in the town of Milford, in the county of Wayne, one numbered in the general plan of said town, four hundred and forty-seven, the other four hundred and sixty-two, bounded by High-street, and lots number four hundred and thirty-three, and four hundred

and seventy-six, which said two lots the said John Fitz Randolph, deceased, did in his lifetime sell, and engage to convey to the said Mathew Ridgway, on the payment of the money, agreeable to the terms of the contract with the said John Fitz Randolph, deceased; which deed when duly executed by the said administratrix, shall be as effectual in law, to all intents and purposes, as if the said John Fitz Randolph, in his lifetime, had executed the same. CHAPTER LXXIX.

An ACT for the relief of David Davidson, an old soldier.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state-treasurer, be and he is hereby directed to pay unto David Davidson, or order, the sum of forty dollars immediately and an annuity of forty dollars during his life, payable half yearly, to commence from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twelve. CHAPTER LXXX.

An ACT to cede to the United States, the jurisdiction over a piece of land at Presque' Isle, for a light house.

WHEREAS, the congress of the United States, by an act passed the first day of May, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and ten, authorized the erection of a light house at or near Presque' Isle, and appropriated a sum of money to defray the expense of erecting the same :

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That for the purpose of erecting a light-house, jurisdiction is hereby ceded to the United States, in and over the following tract or piece A piece of ground ceded to the U.
