Six poor children to be taught gratis.

SECT. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That there shall be admitted into said academy any number of poor children who may at any time be offered, in order to be taught gratis: Provided, the number so admitted and taught, shall at no time he greater than six.

Accounts of the trustees to be annually exhibited auditors.

Sect. 111. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the accounts respecting said academy, shall be annually presented by the trustees thereof, to the auditors of Bedford to the county county, to be examined and reported by them in the same manner that the public accounts of the county of Bedford from time to time are directed to be audited by the laws of this commonwealth.

Repeal of a former act.

SECT. IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That an act incorporating the Bedford academy, and granting a sum of money thereto, passed the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ten, be and the same is hereby repealed.
