CHAPTER CXXII.

An ACT for the immediate relief of Emanuel Bollinger and Valentine Weirick.

WHEREAS it appears that Emanuel Bollinger and Valentine Weirick, in the county of Dauphin, were enlisted as private soldiers in captain Matthew Smith's company, in the first Pennsylvania regiment, which marched from Lancaster county to Boston in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy-five, and from thence marched under the command of general Benedict Arnold, to Quebec, during which period they suffered great hardships and had to support themselves for about seven months, for which support they have not received any remuneration: Therefore,

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Emanuel Bollinger be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of forty dollars; and Valentine Weirick be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of sixty dollars, to be in full for rations respectively furnished by themselves, whilst on an expedition against the British at Quebec, to be paid to them respectively, or their attornies, by the state-treasurer, immediately after the passing of this act.*

CHAPTER CXXIII.

An ACT granting an annuity to Edward Quigley, a wounded soldier of the revolutionary war.

BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That

the sum of forty dollars be and the same is hereby granted to Edward Quigley, of the county of Centre, to be paid immediately after the passing of this act, to him or his order, and that an annuity of forty dollars be granted for the use of the said Edward Quigley, for life, to be paid half yearly to John G. Lowrey, of Bellefonte, his executors, or administrators, or his, or their order, to commence on the first day of January last; which annuity shall be expended by the said John G. Lowrey, his executors, or administrators, or his or their lawful attorney, in providing clothing and diet, for the said Edward Quigley, and it shall be the duty of the said John G. Lowrey, his executors or administrators, or his or their lawful attorney, to make an annual return to the orphans' court of Centre county, on oath or affirmation, how and in what manner he or they have executed the trust in him or them confided by this act; and the clerk of said court shall perform all the services directed by this act without fee or reward.

\$40 granted to Edward Quigley. And an annuity of like amount. Payable to John G. Lowrey. How to be expended. Return to be made to the orphans' court.

CHAPTER CXXIV.

An ACT granting (in trust) to Susanna Stokely, widow of captain Nehemiah Stokely, deceased, such quantity of donation land as officers of his rank were entitled to.

BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the land officers be and they are hereby directed to issue a patent or patents to Susanna Stokely, widow of captain Nehemiah Stokely, deceased, in trust for the children of the said Nehemiah Stokely, for such quantity of donation land as officers of equal rank in the revolutionary army were entitled to.
