An ACT to authorize the governor to appoint commissioners to lay out a state road, beginning at the Burn! Cabirs in Bedford county. thence to Waterford in Mifflin county, thence either to the mouth of Fishing creek, or to Clark's ferry, in Cumberland county.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pannsylvania in general assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same. ers to lay out That the governor be and he is here by authorized to appoint three commissioners to lay out and mark a state road beginning at the Burnt Cabins and running from thence by the nearest and best route to Waterford, in Mifflin county, thence the Cabins either nearest and best route, either to the mouth of Fishing creek, or to Clark's ferry, on the Susquehanna, in the county of Cumberland; and the said commissioners shall proceed to Clark's ferry, perform the said service at such time as the governor shall direct, and they shall make out a draught of the said road, and deposit a copy of the same in the office of the clerk of the court of quarter sessions, in each county through which the said road shall pass; and the said clerks respectively shall enand deposit a ter the same on the records, which shall be a record of said road, and from henceforth shall be to all intents and purposes a public highway, and shall be opened and kept in repair in the same manner as other roads laid out by the authority of the court in the counties aforesaid.

> SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That the said commissioners shall receive each, two dollars for every day they shall be necessarily employed in the service aforesaid, together with a reasonable compensation for the hands necessarily employed in survering, chaining, and marking the lines of the aforesaid road; and the expense that may be so incurred in laying out and marking the same in each of the several counties through which it may pass, shall be paid by the counties respectively, on warrants drawn by the county commissioners of each, on the treasurer thereof, in favour

of the commissioners to be appointed as aforesaid.
