

CHAPTER CLXXXIV.

A further SUPPLEMENT to the act entitled " An act to provide a more effectual method of settling the public accounts of the commissioners and treasurers of the respective counties."

BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That when the accounts of the county commissioners, within the county of Lancaster, shall have been or may be settled by the auditors, according to the directions of the act to which this is a supplement, and the commissioners shall have appealed or may appeal from such settlement and an issue be directed thereon, it shall be the duty of the court of quarter sessions, and they are hereby authorized in such case, to employ counsel, and to draw their order on the county treasurer, in favour of such counsel for such reasonable compensation as shall be agreed on for his services, which the said treasurer is hereby required and enjoined, to pay out of the county stock ; but this act shall not be construed, to extend to give any such power to the said court in any other case, than that of the county commissioners, appealing from the settlement of their own accounts, and by which the said commissioners are respectively made chargeable.

When the commissioners of Lancaster county appeal from the settlement of their accounts the court of quarter sessions may employ counsel, &c. How compensated.

CHAPTER CLXXXV.

A SUPPLEMENT to the act, entitled " An act granting certain privileges to, and enlarging the regiment of artillery, attached to the first brigade first division Pennsylvania militia, and for the better organization of the cavalry of the city and county of Philadelphia ;" and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That whenever two hundred or more of the citizens residing within the bounds of any division of the militia of this commonwealth, shall hereafter associate and form themselves into a regiment of artillery, they shall be divided into eight companies, and shall be authorized to elect one lieutenant colonel commandant, and two majors, with the same staff and company officers as are authorized in the first section of the act to which this is a supplement ; and to each regiment so formed, there may be two troops of*

200 citizens in any division, when formed into a regiment of artillery.
