And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That when twenty persons or more shall have subscribed fifty When twenty shares of the said stock, the commissioners shall certify under have subscribed their hands and seals, the names of the subscribers, and the number of shares subscribed by each, to the governor; and Letters patent thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the governor, by letters patent under his hand and the seal of the state, to create and erect the subscribers, and if the said subscription be not full at the time, those also who shall afterwards subscribe, to the number aforesaid, into one body, politic and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name, style, and title of, "The President, Managers and Company of the Ma-Style of corporietta, Richland, and Mountjoy Turnpike Road," and by the ration. said name the subscribers shall have perpetual succession, and all the privileges and franchises, incident to a corpora-Their privileges tion, and shall be capable of taking and holding their said and franchises. capital stock, and the increase and profits thereof, and of enlarging the same from time to time by new subscriptions, in such manner and form as they shall think proper, if such enlargement shall be found necessary to fulfil the intent of this act; and of purchasing, taking, and holding, to them and their successors and assigns, and of selling, and transferring, and conveying in fee simple, or for any less estate, all such lands, tenements, hereditaments and estates, real and personal, as shall be necessary to them in the prosecution of their works; and of suing and being sued; and of doing all and every other matter and thing, which a corporation or body politic may lawfully do.

give notice, in two of the public newspapers in the borough of Lancaster, of the time and place by them to be appointed, not less than twenty days from the publication of the first notice, at which time and place the said subscribers shall proceed to organize the said corporation, and shall choose by a majority of votes of the said subscribers, by ballot to be delivered in person or by proxy duly authorized, one president and > ner to be chosen, eight managers, one treasurer, and such other officers as they shall think necessary to conduct the business of the said company for one year, and until other officers shall be chosen; and shall and may make such by-laws, rules, orders and regulations, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of the United States, and of this state, as shall be necessary for the well ordering the affairs of the said company; and generally have like powers, authorities and privileges, necessary for carrying on and completing the said turnpike road, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications, restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures, and be entitled to like tolls and profits, in proportion to the distance, as are given and granted to the president, managers and company, of the Lancaster and Susquehanna turnpike road: provided, that no toll be demanded or taken from any person passing from one part of his or her farm to another part thereof, and to or from any place of public worship, or funeral, or from the militia on days of muster: and provided also, that if the company shall not proceed to carry on the said works in three years after the passing of this act, or shall not within seven years afterwards, complete the said road according to the true intent and meaning of this act, then in either of these cases, all and singular the rights, liberties and franchises, hereby granted to the said company, shall revert to the commonwealth.

CHAPTER XXIX.

A SUPPLEMENT to the act, entitled, " An act for raising by way of lottery, a sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, to be applied to the defraying the expenses of paving the streets in the borough of Lancaster, in the county of Lancaster."

WHEREAS the surviving managers of the Lancaster street lottery, have represented to the legislature, that they were authorized by an act of the legislature, passed ninth March, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, to raise
