

give notice, in two of the public newspapers in the borough of Lancaster, of the time and place by them to be appointed, not less than twenty days from the publication of the first notice, at which time and place the said subscribers shall proceed to organize the said corporation, and shall choose by a majority of votes of the said subscribers, by ballot to be delivered in person or by proxy duly authorized, one president and eight managers, one treasurer, and such other officers as they shall think necessary to conduct the business of the said company for one year, and until other officers shall be chosen; and shall and may make such by-laws, rules, orders and regulations, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of the United States, and of this state, as shall be necessary for the well ordering the affairs of the said company; and generally have like powers, authorities and privileges, necessary for carrying on and completing the said turnpike road, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications, restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures, and be entitled to like tolls and profits, in proportion to the distance, as are given and granted to the president, managers and company, of the Lancaster and Susquehanna turnpike road; *provided*, that no toll be demanded or taken from any person passing from one part of his or her farm to another part thereof, and to or from any place of public worship, or funeral, or from the militia on days of muster: *and provided also*, that if the company shall not proceed to carry on the said works in three years after the passing of this act, or shall not within seven years afterwards, complete the said road according to the true intent and meaning of this act, then in either of these cases, all and singular the rights, liberties and franchises, hereby granted to the said company, shall revert to the commonwealth.

What officers, and in what manner to be chosen.

Authorized to make by-laws.

CHAPTER XXIX.

*A SUPPLEMENT to the act, entitled, "An act for raising by way of lottery, a sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, to be applied to the defraying the expenses of paving the streets in the borough of Lancaster, in the county of Lancaster."*

WHEREAS the surviving managers of the Lancaster street lottery, have represented to the legislature, that they were authorized by an act of the legislature, passed ninth March, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, to raise

by way of lottery the sum of twenty thousand dollars, to defray the expenses of paving the streets of the borough of Lancaster; that in pursuance of the said act, three classes of the said lottery have been drawn, and the proceeds of the said lottery have been expended in accomplishing the objects of the said act, but that a part of the design yet remains to be carried into effect, and that several of the managers are now dead, and the aid of the legislature is required to supply the vacancies occasioned thereby, to enable the parties interested therein to complete the objects of the said lottery, and to discharge sundry contingent debts and expenses arising out of the same: Therefore,

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That James Humes, William Montgomery, Emanuel Reigart, John Gundacker, John Hoff, Samuel White, Jonas Metzgar, John Swar, Christian Hoover, John Bomberger, Benjamin Shaum, and Abraham Witmer, be and they are hereby added to the surviving managers, appointed in and by the act to which this is a supplement, who together with the said surviving managers, shall forthwith proceed to carry into full effect the objects of the said act of ninth March, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, and if any of the said managers appointed by this act, should refuse to act, or die, the governor is hereby authorized, by an appointment of a manager or managers, to supply such deficiency in the board of managers, from time to time, as occasion may require.

James Humes and others authorized to carry into effect the act of March 9th 1797.

Governor authorized to supply vacancies.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said managers appointed by this act, together with the surviving managers under the act to which this is a supplement, be, and they are hereby authorized to devise a scheme for the fourth class of said lottery, in lieu of the one approved of by the late governor, for a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars: *provided,* that before the said managers shall proceed to the drawing of the said lottery, the scheme of the said fourth class shall be laid before the governor, and be by him approved: *and provided also,* that the additional managers by this act appointed, or to be by the governor appointed, shall enter into a similar bond, and be in all respects, and in the same manner, bound faithfully to perform the duties required by this act, as is mentioned and contained in the act to which this is a supplement, as far as respects this class.
