CHAPTER XLVII.

An ACT to compensate Cornelius Vanhorn, a Pennsylvania claimant of lands in Luzerne county.

WHEREAS Cornelius Vanhorn, a Pennsylvania claimant of lot number twenty, in the manor of Sunbury, in the county of Luzerne, has prosecuted his claim to the same by ejectment in the circuit court and supreme court of the United States, and has thereby established the title of this state to the lands in that county in opposition to what is called the Connecticut title or claim; and having afterwards as such claimant, brought an action against this commonwealth for the value of said land in the manner directed by law, the officers of the accountant department did not consider themselves authorized to pay the amount of the verdict rendered in favour of the said Vanhorn on the said suit, by reason of the sum valued to the Pennsylvania claimant, on the said lot being heretofore paid to the agent of the proprietors, by the officers of a former administration: For remedy thereof,

SECT. I. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That 2225 dollars and the treasurer of this state, be and he is hereby directed to pay to cornelius Cornelius Vanhorn, a Pennsylvania claimant, the sum of two Vanhorn. thousand two hundred and twenty-five dollars and eighty-three cents, in full for lot number twenty, in the manor of Sunbury,

township of Kingston, in the county of Luzerne, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

CHAPTER XIVIII.

An ACT to enable the accountant officers to adjust and settle the accounts of services and expenditures in relation to the militia, called into the services of the United States and of this State.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and bouse of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the accountant officers are hereby authorized and required to adjust and settle the accounts of the officers who were engaged in pursuance of the orders of the governor of this commonwealth, in calling out and providing provisions and accommodations, and marching to the place of rendezvous, the volunteers and militia of Pennsylvania which have been called into the service of the United States.

Secr. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the accountant officers shall regulate themselves in the to the usages adjustment of said accounts, by the principles and usages in and practices under the United States for similar services and exadjustment of said accounts, by the principles and usages in penses: provided however, that if it shall be made appear to the satisfaction of the accountant officers, that other and greater services and supplies were rendered, or expenses necessarily incurred in relation to the volunteers and militia aforesaid, it shall be their duty to admit the same.

Sect. III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the accountant officers are hereby directed to Accounts of supernumerary officers to be set settle the accounts of the officers, who on the organizatled. tion of the militia, at the place of rendezvous, become supernumerary.

Auditor general to draw war-rants to the state treasurer for the amount of accounts settled.

SECT. IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That on the settlement of the accounts aforesaid, the auditor general shall draw his warrant on the state treasurer for the balance which may appear to be due thereon, and said balance so found due shall be paid by the state treasurer out of any money in the treasury.
