CHAPTER LXX.

An ACT to grant compensation for extra services, to the militia of this commonwealth now in service, under the command of General William Henry Harrison.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That in 12 dollars per month granted to case any of the militia of this commonwealth, now under the militia who shall command of General William Henry Harrison, shall agree to services for two serve for a term not more than two months from and after the months after first day of April next, and provided the whole or any part of term of service shall expire. such militia shall volunteer and subject themselves to the orders of the commander in chief of the north-western army, to perform such service as he may require of them, a bounty at the rate of twelve dollars per month, shall be paid out of the treasury of this state, to each commissioned and staff officer, and also to each non-commissioned officer, musician and private, his or their legal representatives; and the bounty so allowed, shall Bounty to be apportioned and paid to such volunteers, for and according portioned according to their time to the time they shall respectively continue to serve, after the of service. expiration of their present term of service: provided, that if any provise in favor of the said militia who shall volunteer as aforesaid shall be killed in battle, or die during the time for which he shall have vomay be slain. lunteered as aforesaid, his legal representatives shall receive the bounty for the whole period for which he volunteered, and for which his services were accepted.
