either by sale, lease or otherwise, and to apply the proceeds thereof to the benefit of said institution.

SECT. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That it shall be the duty of the said trustees to lay a detailed Accounts of musstatement of the manner, in which this appropriation has been ited to county expended, before the auditors of the county of Butler, whose auditors, &cc. duty it shall be to settle, adjust and publish the same, as public accounts of commissioners are settled, adjusted and published.

CHAPTER CIII.

An ACT authorizing the administrators of the estate of Casper Wight, to convey a tract of land in Antis township, Huntingdon county.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the legislature by the petition of John Barlet that he purchased in partnership with Casper Wight, a certain tract of land called Rich Land, containing three hundred and twelve acres, on the waters of little Juniata, in Antis township, Huntingdon county; and whereas, it appears that the title by purchase was conveyed to Casper Wight, who since died intestate, and it further appears that the land was divided between the parties before the death of the intestate, and that the said Barlet had paid his full share of the purchase money, and that it was the intention of the deceased to make him a title for the one half of the said tract of land: Therefore,

Administrators of Casper Wight authorized to convey land.

SECT. I. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That Thomas Wilson and Jacob Wight, administrators of Casper Wight, deceased, are hereby authorized to make and execute a good and sufficient title to John Barlet, his heirs and assigns for a tract of land situate in Antis township, Huntingdon county, agreeably to the division made of the said tract of land, between John Barlet and the deceased, as the same is meted and bounded; which title shall be as good and available in law as if it had been made by the said Casper Wight in his life time; provided, that nothing in this act contained, shall be understood to injure or prejudice the right of any other individual or individuals.
