

## CHAPTER CVI.

*An ACT in aid of the Gap and Newport turnpike road.*

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That as soon as the president, managers, and company, of the Gap and Newport turnpike road, shall have perfected the said road from the Philadelphia and Lancaster turnpike, any distance not less than five miles, progressively, in a direction towards Newport, and the same having been examined, approved of and licensed by the governor, agreeably to the provisions of the eleventh section of the act to which this is a further supplement, entitled, "An act to authorize the governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the Philadelphia and Lancaster turnpike road, in Lancaster county, at or near the Gap tavern, to the line of the state of Delaware," passed the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seven, the governor shall thereupon draw his warrant on the state treasurer, in favour of the president and managers of said company, for the sum of two thousand dollars; and so soon as one other section of said road of not less than five miles shall be completed and approved of as aforesaid, the governor shall draw his warrant for the further sum of two thousand dollars; and so soon as the third section of not less than five miles of said road shall have been completed and approved of in manner aforesaid, the governor shall draw his warrant in favour of said president and managers for the sum of one thousand dollars, which will complete the payment of the appropriation on behalf of this commonwealth for one hundred shares in the stock of said company, by an act passed twenty-first of March, one thousand eight hundred and eight; and it shall be the duty of the said president and managers, and they are hereby required, upon receiving such warrant, to cause certificates of shares of the stock of said company to the amount then paid, to be deposited in the office of the state treasurer; and the dividends arising thereon shall, from time to time, as they are declared, be paid by the treasurer of the said company into the treasury of the state: and it shall be the duty of the auditor general in case of refusal or neglect to enforce the payment thereof as in other claims of the commonwealth.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the act, entitled "An act for the improvement of the state," passed the twenty-first day of March, one

CHAPTER CVII.

An ACT authorizing the governor to incorporate a company, to make an artificial road from the town of Manchester, in the county of York, to intersect the York, Conewago, and Canal turnpike road, between the fifth and seventh mile stones.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That George Small and Andrew Cramer, of the county of York, Frederick Nagle, James Mehaffey, Matthias Rank, Lewis Leader, Abraham Zublin and Henry Cassel, of the county of Lancaster, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several duties herein after mentioned, viz. they shall on or before the first Monday of April next, procure two books, and in each of them enter as follows: "We whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the president, managers and company, of the Manchester turnpike road, the sum of fifty dollars for every share of stock in said company, set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and proportions, and at such times as shall be determined by the president and managers of said company, in pursuance of an act of the general assembly of this commonwealth, entitled, "An act authorizing the governor to incorporate a company to make an artificial road from the town of Manchester, in the county of York, to intersect the York, Conewago, and Canal turnpike road, between the fifth and seventh mile stones; and shall thereupon give notice in two public newspapers, the one to be printed in the borough of York and the other in the borough of Lancaster, four weeks at least, of the times and places when and where in the borough of Marietta, and the town of Manchester, the said books shall be kept open to receive subscriptions for the stock of said company; at which respective times and places some two of the said commissioners shall attend, and shall permit and suffer all persons of lawful age, who shall offer to subscribe in the said books, in their own
