in consequence of the aforementioned grant, any number of poor children that may at any time be offered, in order to be taught gratis; provided, the number so admitted and taught, shall at no time be greater than four, and that none of the said children so admitted shall continue in said academy to be taught gratis, should others apply, longer than two years.

CHAPTER CXIX

An ACT granting a tract of donation land, to Thomas Little, a soldier in the revolutionary war.

Donation tract granted to Thomas Little.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the officers of the land office are hereby authorized and required to draw and patent in the usual manner, a tract of donation land, unto Thomas Little of Franklin township, Fayette county, containing two hundred acres.

CHAPTER CXX.

An ACT laying a tax on dogs, in the counties of Washington and Fayette, and for other purposes.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall be the duty of the commissioners of the counties of above a certain age.
