CHAPTER CLXXXV.

An ACT for the relief James Crawford of Lycoming county, a major of the late twelfth Pennsylvania regiment.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be and he is hereby directed to pay to James Crawford, a major of the late twelfth Pennsylvania regiment, or order, the sum of sixty dollars immediately after the passing of this act, and an annuity of sixty dollars, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, to be paid half yearly during life.

An annuity of 60 dollars granted to James Crawford.

CHAPTER CLXXXVI.

A further SUPPLEMENT to an act entitled, "An act for the relief of Dickinson college."

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be and he is hereby required, to suspend for the term of five years from the passing of this act, all legal proceedings against the trustees of Dickinson college, for the recovery of the money granted on loan to said trustees agreeably to the provisions of the act to which this is a further supplement, passed the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.
