CHAPTER III.

A SUPPLEMENT to an act entitled “An act erecting part of Northumberland county, into a separate county, to be called Columbia.”

WHEREAS doubts have arisen respecting the jurisdiction of the judges and other officers of the county of Northumberland within the county of Columbia, from the organization thereof unto the first Monday of March, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, and also at what time the first court is to commence in said county: Therefore,

SECT. I. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the first court of common pleas, general quarter sessions, and orphans' court, in and for the county of Columbia, shall commence and be holden on the first Monday of January, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, at such house as shall be designated by the commissioners of said county, as provided in the act to which this is a supplement.

When the courts of Columbia shall be held.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That no suit or prosecution which has been heretofore commenced or shall commence before the first Monday of January, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, in the courts of the county of Northumberland, shall be delayed, discontinued or affected by this act, or the act to which this is a supplement, but the same shall be proceeded in and carried into complete execution.

Suits commenced before the first Monday of January 1814 shall not be affected by this act or the original.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all certioraries of and appeals from the judgment of any justice of the peace of the said county of Columbia, and all criminal prosecutions which have originated or may originate before the first Monday of January, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, in said county, shall be proceeded in as heretofore in the courts of common pleas and quarter sessions of the county of Northumberland, and all process to issue from the courts of the said county of Columbia returnable to the second term in said county, shall bear test as of the first Monday of January, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen.

SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of the act to which this is a supplement, as is supplied, altered or amended by this act, be and the same is hereby repealed.*

CHAPTER IV.

An ACT to enable the governor of this commonwealth, to incorporate a company for making an artificial road, by the best and nearest route, from the Philadelphia and Lancaster turnpike road, through the village of Strasburg in Lancaster county, to the Susquehanna bridge at M'Call's ferry, and from thence to the city of Baltimore.

Commissioners to carry this act into effect.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Eliston Perrot, Paul Beck, William Sansom, Jacob Downing, William Davidson, and James Taylor, of the city of Philadelphia; Edward Brien, John Neff, Nathaniel W. Sample, Rudolph Kegey, of the county of Lancaster, in the state of Pennsylvania, and General Charles Ridgeley of Hampton, Benjamin Ellicott, James Carroll, Luke Tiernan, Henry Paysan, William Wilson, John M'Kim, junior Robert Miller, James Carey, and Charles Jessop, of the city of Baltimore, in the state of Maryland, be and they hereby are appointed commissioners to do and perform the several things hereinafter mentioned; that is to say, They shall on or before the first Monday in July next, procure one or more books, and in each of them enter as follows:*

Their duties.

"We, whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the president, managers and company of the Baltimore and Strasburg turnpike road, the sum of one hundred dollars for every share of stock in the said company set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and proportions and at such times as shall be determined by the president and managers of the said company, in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, confirmed by the General Assembly of the state of Maryland, entitled, "An act to enable the governor of this commonwealth to incorporate a company for making an artificial road, by the best and nearest route, from the Philadelphia and Lancaster turnpike road, through the village of Strasburg to the Susquehanna bridge at M'Call's ferry, and from thence to the city of Baltimore."
