## CHAPTER XXXIX.

An ACT for the election of a constable in the borough of Orwigsburg.

Election of con-

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the electors residing in the borough of Orwigsburg, in the county of Schuylkill, shall on the third Friday in March, yearly, and every year thereafter, elect two suitable persons being citizens of said borough, for the office of constable, and shall return the . names of the persons so elected to the next court of general quarter sessions of the peace to be holden for said county, and the court shall appoint one of them constable for the said borough; which constable when appointed by the court shall have the same power and shall be subject to all the penalties which constables have and are subjected to, under the act entitled, an act to amend and consolidate with its supplements the act entitled "An act for the recovery of debts and demands not exceeding one hundred dollars before a justice of the peace, and for the election of constables and for other purposes.

## CHAPTER XL.

An ACT releasing to Anna Maria Loyer the right of this commonwealth to a certain escheated estate.

WHEREAS it is represented to the legislature that John Loyer, late of Unity township, Westmoreland county, deceased, died intestate without heirs or any known kindred, seized of certain real and personal estate which is supposed to have escheated to this commonwealth; and whereas it is further represented that the said John left a widow, named Anna Maria to whom it appears just that the title of this commonwealth to the said estate should be released: therefore,

SECT. I. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly Certain property met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That vested in Ann Maria Loper. all the right, title and interest of this commonwealth, by reason of the death of the said John Lover, of and in a certain small tract or piece of land which was conveyed to him on the seventeenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine, by John Bossart, and Elizabeth his wife, situate in Unity township, Westmoreland county, containing twentyseven and an half acres of land strict measure, be and the same is hereby released to Anna Maria Loyer, widow of the said John, her heirs and assigns, and also all the right, title and interest of And personal es the commonwealth of and in the personal estate of the said John tate. Loyer, in the hands of Jacob Poorman, administrator of the said John Loyer, or in the hands of any other person or persons with the interest due and accrued thereon': provided, that nothing in this Proviso, act contained shall in any wise prejudice the rights of individuals, or impair any other title to the said real or personal estate than that which the commonwealth has or might have by reason of the said escheat.

## CHAPTER XLI:

A SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled. " An act to enable the governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road, beginning at or near Downingstown, in the county of Chester, to Cornwall furnace, in the county of Dauphin, and from thence to the borough of Harrisburg."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and bouse of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the time allowed to the president, managers, and company of the Part of the original act extend.
