CHAPTER XLII.

A SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled, "An act to enable the governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road, beginning at or near Downingtown, in the county of Chester, to Cornwall furnace, in the county of Dauphin, and from thence to the borough of Harrisburg."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the time allowed to the president, managers, and company of the Downingtown, Ephrata and Harrisburg turnpike road, for completing said road, be and same is hereby extended seven years from and after the passing of this act, at the expiration of which time, if said road shall not be completed according to the true intent and meaning of the original act incorporating said company, passed March twenty-fourth, one thousand eight hundred and three, then in such case it shall and may be lawful for the legislature of this commonwealth to resume all and singular the*
