BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assem- Duties of the bly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That president, mana the president, managers and company of the Marietta, Richland and Mountjoy turnpike road, for the time being, be, and they are hereby authorised and required to do the several things hereinafter mentioned; that is to say, they shall on or before the first day of April next, lay down the route, and as soon as may be thereafter, make and complete an artificial road; beginning Privilege of at the river Susquehanna, in the east end of the borough of Marietta, thence along Bank street, and through lands of Henry Cassel and John Crow, to the intersection of the Marietta, Richland and Mountjoy turnpike at Henry Share's new buildings, and the said president and managers shall make the said road in the same manner, and of the same materials, and shall have the same powers, rights, privileges, liberties, and franchises, and shall be subject to the same duties, qualifications, restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures, and be entitled to the like tolls and profits of the said road, as if it had been made under the authority of the act to which this is a supplement.

SECT. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, Certain capital to the said president and managers are hereby authorised to to the company.
