

contingent costs and charges being first deducted) among all the stockholders respectively, and shall on the first Monday of January and July in every year, publish the half yearly dividend to be made of the said clear profits and income to and among the stockholders, and of the time and place, when and where the same shall be paid, and shall cause the same to be paid accordingly.

SECT. XIX. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said company shall not have power to issue any orders or notes in the nature of bank notes, to be indorsers on any note or notes in their corporate capacity, or to make discounts or receive deposits after the manner of any bank or banks, and in case the said company should at any time hereafter act contrary to the provisions contained in this section, their chartered privileges shall be null and void.

SECT. XX. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if the company to be incorporated by the provisions of this act, shall not within twelve years from and after the date thereof, erect and complete a canal and lock navigation as described by this act, then all the privileges hereby granted shall cease and determine.

SECT. XXI. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if the said corporation shall at any time hereafter misuse or abuse any of the chartered privileges hereby granted, the legislature may at any time resume all and singular, the rights, liberties, privileges and franchises hereby granted to the said company.

CHAPTER XCI.

A further SUPPLEMENT to an act entitled "An act for re-establishing the charter of the Second Presbyterian church in the city of Philadelphia, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the separation of the society or church in the Northern Liberties, erected and constituted by the trustees of the Second Presbyterian Church in the city of Philadelphia, as agreed upon by the pew-holders of both churches, and the trustees from the said corporation be and the same is hereby confirmed; and that all and singular the rights, powers, privileges and immunities of the

said corporation be and remain and be had and enjoyed by the said corporation in as full and ample a manner as if such separation had not been made:

Powers and privileges of the corporation not impaired by this act.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the trustees of the Second Presbyterian Church in the city of Philadelphia be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to grant and convey by good and proper deed or deeds or assurances in the law for the use of the church in the Northern Liberties, the real estate which by the said articles of separation was agreed should be the exclusive property of said church, and also the right of burial also by said articles agreed to be held by said church, which conveyance may be made either to trustees for the use of said church, or in case the said church shall be hereafter incorporated, then to the same by its corporate name.

Trustees of Second Presbyterian Church authorized to convey real estate.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said corporation be and the same is hereby enabled to have and to hold messuages, houses, lands and tenements, rents, annuities and other hereditaments and real estates, not exceeding the clear yearly value of two thousand dollars lawful money of the United States; which sum shall be taken and esteemed exclusive of the monies arising from the letting of the pews, and the contributions belonging to the church, and also exclusive of the monies arising from the opening of the ground for burials.

May hold property to the amount of 2000 dollars exclusively of pew-rent, &c.

CHAPTER XCII.

An ACT for the relief of Henry M'Ewen and Jacob Rosenstelle, old soldiers.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Henry M'Ewen, or order, the sum of forty dollars, immediately after the passing of this act, and that an annuity of forty dollars be granted for the use of the said Henry M'Ewen, for life, to be paid half yearly to Francis M'Ewen, of Centre county, his executors or administrators, or his or their order, to commence on the first day of January last, which annuity shall be expended by the said Francis M'Ewen his executors or administrators, or his or their lawful attorney, in providing clothing and diet for the said Henry M'Ewen, and it shall be the duty of the said Francis M'Ewen his executors or administrators or his or their lawful at-
