CHAPTER CIII.

- A SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled " An act to remedy defects in the titles of real estate, purchased by certain emigrants within this commonwealth, during the time they were aliens.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and bouse of represent tatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the provisions of the act entitled "An act to remedy defects in the titles of real estate purchased by certain emigrants within this commonwealth, during the time they were aliens," passed the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eleven, be, and the same are hereby extended to all purchases, contracts and sales, made since the passing of said act.

Sect. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall be lawful for any alien, who, on the eighteenth day certain aliens of June, one thousand eight hundred and twelve, resided, and having filed their declaration, &c. has since continued to reside in this state, and who is a subject convey lands to a of any sovereign, state, or nation, at war with the United States, certain amount. after having filed according to law, a declaration of his intention to become a citizen of the United States, to receive, hold and convey any lands and tenements within this commonwealth not exceeding in quantity two hundred acres, nor in value twenty thousand dollars, as fully to all intents and purposes as a citizen of the United States can do.

CHAPTER CIV.
