CHAPTER CVI.

An ACT for the relief of Henry Shuler and Matthias Armbruster, old soldiers.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized to pay William P. Maclay of Mifflin county, or his order, forty dollars immediately after the passing of this act, to be applied to the use of Henry Shuler ; and that an annuity of forty dollars, to commence the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, be paid half yearly to the said William P. Maclay, or his order, to be applied to the use of the said Henry during life ; and the said William P. Maclay shall annually render to the Orphans' court of Mifflin county, on account of the receipts and expenditures and in what manner he has applied the money for the use of the said Henry Shuler, and said accounts shall be filed in the office of the clerk of the court without fee or reward.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby directed to pay unto Matthias Armbruster of the city of Philadelphia, or order, the sum of forty dollars immediately after the passing of this act ; and an annuity of forty dollars to be paid half year-

CHAPTER CVII.

An ACT for the relief of Martin Reiley.

WHEREAS it appears to the legislature that Martin Reily of the town of Bedford is owner of a lot of ground marked number two in the general plan of the manor of Bedford, containing five acres and one hundred and one perches adjoining said town, through which lot a public road commonly called the State Road has been laid out and opened; that for the damages thereby occasioned the said Martin Reily has not been able to get any compensation, and the existing laws affording no relief in such case he has petitioned the legislature for redress: Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the court of quarter sessions of Bedford county upon application to them made by Martin Reily of said county, at any time within one year after the passing of this act shall appoint viewers to ascertain and adjudge the amount of damages (if any) by him sustained, which viewers to be appointed shall be the same in number, shall have the same qualifications, shall take the same oath or affirmation, and shall proceed and make report in the same manner as prescribed in the fourteenth section of the act entitled, "An act for laying out, making, and keeping in repair the public roads and highways within this commonwealth, and for laying out private roads," and by the second section of the supplement to same act, passed the third of April, one thousand eight hundred and nine; and if their report shall be approved of by said court, the amount of damages assessed (if any) shall be paid to the said Martin Reily by the treasurer of Bedford county, out of the county stock, in the manner prescribed for other cases in the fourteenth section of the act first herein before mentioned.
