a certificate from the commissioners, to the treasurer of said counties, as the case may be, the treasurer shall pay the same.

SECT. x. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of any act or acts of the General Assembly as is altered or supplied by this act, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER CXVII.

An ACT to enlarge the limits of the borough of Bedford.

BE it enacted by the senate and house of representa-tives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That The borough of from and after the passage of this act, the bounds of the borough of Bedford shall be enlarged as follows: to wit, by extending the south boundary line of said borough, to the Cumberland Valley run, thence down said run to the Juniatta river, thence down said river to the original boundary line of said borough, and the ground comprehended in these limits, shall be annexed to, and be a part of the said borough, as effectually as if the same had been included in the original act of incorporation.

BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is bereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Roswell Welles and Sarah Hodge, executors of the last will and testament of Jeremiah Coleman, deceased, be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered so soon as Amza B. Baldwin and Summers Baldwin shall pay to the executors aforesaid, the fourth

part of the purchase money, with the lawful interest thereon due The executors of for patenting the same, to make and execute to Amza B. Bald-Roswell Welles, win and Summers Baldwin, a deed of conveyance for all the Baldwin, Sc. right, title, estate and interest, which the aforesaid Jeremiah Coleman had in his life time to the one fourth part of lot number forty, in the second tier, fifth division of lots in Plymouth township, Luzerne county, which deed shall vest the title as fully in the said Amza B. Baldwin and Summers Baldwin, as if the said Jeremiah Coleman had conveyed the same in his life time: Provided, That nothing herein contained, shall affect or impair Proviso. the right of any other individual or individuals.

## CHAPTER CXIX.

An ACT erecting part of Wayne county into a separate county.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Part of Wayne all that part of Wayne county lying south and east of a direct county erected into a new one line from the lower end of Big Eddy on Delaware river, to the tobecalled Pike, mouth of Wallenpaupack creek, and thence up the same to the main forks thereof, thence up the south branch to where the most southern branch crosses the north and south road, from thence due west, to the line of Luzerne county, be and the same is hereby declared to be erected into a county henceforth to be called Pike.

SECT. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, Rights & privile the inhabitants of the said county of Pike from and after leges of the inhabitants of the first day of October next, shall be entitled to, and at all times Pike sounty. thereafter, shall have all and singular, the courts, jurisdictions, offices, rights and privileges to which the inhabitants of other counties of this state are entitled by the constitution and laws of this commonwealth, excepting that there shall be but two courts of common pleas and general quarter sessions held in and for said county of Pike in each year.

SECT. III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, When and where That from and after the first Monday of October next, the courts the courts of of common pleas and general quarter sessions in and for the shall be opened and held at such house as and held.
