CHAPTER CLXVIII.

An ACT to remedy defects in the title to certain lots of land belonging to Chester Monthly Meeting, in Delaware county.

WHEREAS it hath been represented that the members of the religious society of the people called Quakers, constituting Chester monthly meeting, in Delaware, formerly Chester county, have held two lots of ground in Nether Providence township, since the year one thousand seven hundred and twenty-six, and one in Upper Providence township since the year one thousand seven hundred and seventeen, containing in the whole about three acres, for the uses and purposes of a meeting-house and grave-yard lots for said society. by several deeds made to sundry persons in trust, who were, by other deeds under their hands and seals, bound to re-convey the same to other persons when called upon so to do: And whereas, it has been represented that all the persons named in said deeds, made in trust, are deceased, and through neglect of the said society no other trustees did receive conveyances for said ground, whereby the title to said lots is defective: Therefore,

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the right, title, interest, claim, property, and demand whatsoever, either in law or equity, of, in, to, and arising out of two lots of ground in Nether Providence town- certain estate ship, and one lot of ground in Upper Providence township, vested in Delaware county, containing in the whole about three acres, and others. (held in trust by several deeds made to sundry persons for the uses and purposes of a meeting-house and grave-yards, for the religious society of the people called Quakers, constituting Chester monthly meeting in said county) are hereby vested, at the request of said meeting, in George Miller, of Upper Providence township, Joseph Pennel, junior, and James Emlin, of Middletown township, Enos Sharpless, and Eli D. Peirce, of Nether Providence township, and Joseph Rhoads, of Marple township, in as full, effectual, and ample a manner, (and for the same uses, trusts, intents, and purposes, and under like obligations and conditions, to reconvey at any time hereafter to other trustees, as they were vested in and held by the former trustees.
